

Title of the Activity – An Appetite for Reading


Brief description of the activity Have your child work up an appetite for reading a story about food. Make and eat the food you read about.

<u>Brief description of the activity</u> Have your child design a collage of self-illustrated pictures of all the books they read over the summer. Share a summary of each story with friends.



Title of the Activity - Photo Journaling



Brief description of the activity Have your child play word games. These may include scrabble, memory match, bingo, boggle, hangman and suduko.





Title of the Activity – Letter Search


Brief description of the activity Have your child cut out words from either a newspaper or magazine. Paste them on paper and create a letter to a friend.




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

Title of the Activity – T-shirt of Summer Reading





Title of the Activity - Reading Is Fundamental


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

Brief description of the activity Have your child start a journal with a friend or relative. Take turns writing in it all summer long. You can even do this by mail or e-mail.



<u>Brief description of the activity</u> Have your child make their own game board. Include game pieces, cards, and a spinner or dice. Write the directions so that people can play the game with you.



Brief description of the activity Have your child make their own joke book. Have an evening get together with friends and family. Have your child share their jokes aloud in an open microphone forum.



Brief description of the activity Have your child research constellations. On a clear evening lie out on the grass and have them share with you which constellations they see. Create a book describing your shared experience.



<u>**Title of the Activity**</u> – Summer Reading Olympics

Brief description of the activity Have your child make a contract to read as specific number of books during the summer. Have them keep a list of the books they read and write or draw a summary of their favorite part. Then use the guide below to help them decide if they have a gold, silver, or bronze medal for reading during the summer:

Gold = 18 booksSilver = 12 books Bronze = 10 Book

Federal and State Laws

The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida adheres to a policy of nondiscrimination in employment and educational programs/activities and strives affirmatively to provide equal opportunity for all as required by law:

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 - prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, or national origin.

Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended - prohibits discrimination in employment on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, or national origin.

Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972 - prohibits discrimination on the basis of gender.

Age Discrimination in Employment Act of 1967 (ADEA), as amended - prohibits discrimination on the basis of age with respect to individuals who are at least 40.

The Equal Pay Act of 1963, as amended - prohibits gender discrimination in payment of wages to women and men performing substantially equal work in the same establishment.

Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 - prohibits discrimination against the disabled.

Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) - prohibits discrimination against individuals with disabilities in employment, public service, public accommodations and telecommunications.

The Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993 (FMLA) - requires covered employers to provide up to 12 weeks of unpaid, job-protected leave to "eligible" employees for certain family and medical reasons.

The Pregnancy Discrimination Act of 1978 - prohibits discrimination in employment on the basis of pregnancy, childbirth, or related medical conditions.

Florida Educational Equity Act (FEEA) - prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, gender, national origin, marital status, or handicap against a student or employee.

Florida Civil Rights Act of 1992 - secures for all individuals within the state freedom from discrimination because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, handicap, or marital status.

Veterans are provided re-employment rights in accordance with P.L. 93-508 (Federal Law) and Section 295.07 (Florida Statutes), which stipulates categorical preferences for employment.
