## **Environmental Challenges**

- Total funding decrease related to policy shifts from FY '05 to FY '08 (loss of \$377M).
  - Loss of the District Cost Differential (loss of \$212M, cumulative).
  - Declining enrollment from FY '05 (365,784 students) to FY '08 (347,774 students) (loss of \$97M).
  - Economic slowdown: State funding cuts due to lower sales tax collections (loss of \$68M).
- Local funding sources bearing the burden of funding education (Local burden increase from \$800M (40.2%) in FY '04 to \$1,288M (51.4%) in FY '08
- Florida ranks #50 in the funding of public education
- Increased competition from Charter Schools FY '05 (25 schools) to FY '08 (78 schools)
- Increased transportation expenses (fuel)
  - Diesel FY '05 (\$ 9,975,574.10) to FY '08 (\$ 12,356,775.08)
  - Unleaded FY '05 (\$978,152.03) to FY '08 (\$ 2,536,031.30)
  - Every \$0.10 increase = \$360,000
